Smt. Urmila Sathyanarayanan is an internationally acclaimed Bharatanatyam exponent, one of the brightest among the new generation of dancers, with dancing experience of over three decades.

She was trained under the guidance of eminent gurus Padamashri K.N. Dandayuthapani Pillai, Kalaimamani Smt. K.J. Sarasa and Padmabhushan Smt. Kalanidhi Narayanan.

She has conceptualized and choreographed many of her original thematic productions which have been acclaimed as fine display of visual geometry that combines Spirituality, Literature, History, Mythology, Yoga and Science, leading to a divine experience.

She has been invited to perform at every dance festival in India. She has performed extensively in US and Europe, striving to validate the Indian dance form, establishing the depth of spiritual and artistic heritage of India in the international scene.

Urmila has been the recipient of many prestigious awards and titles: the Nrithya Choodamani award, the Best Dancer award from the Indian Fine Arts Society, National Eminence award, Bharata Kala Ratna Lifetime Achievement award 2014, to name only a very few. In 2009, the Indian Fine Arts Society awarded her the Best Natyacharya award in recognition of her excellence in teaching and in 2010, Natya Kalashikamani for her contribution to the dance field.
